

ON NOVEMBER 22, 1963, CBS interrupted its live broadcast of the soap opera *As the World Turns* with a news bulletin from Walter Cronkite announcing that President John F. Kennedy had been shot. Nearly an hour later came an even more unthinkable bulletin confirming that our nation's promising young President had died.

President Kennedy's assassination was a defining historical moment of the 20th century—and the four days of network television coverage chronicling the tragedy and its aftermath represent some of the most moving and memorable moments in broadcast history.

THIRTEEN commemorates the 50th anniversary of President Kennedy's death with specials exploring his life and legacy, continuing our tradition of presenting timely, informative, and enlightening history programming.

Secrets of the Dead: JFK: One PM Central Standard Time (Wed 13th, 10 p.m.) tells the story of two men: the President of the United States—shot in Dallas and rushed to Parkland Hospital, his fate unknown—and CBS anchor Walter Cronkite, who had to get the story right amid the uncertainties of that tragic day. Narrated by George Clooney and featuring an interview with President Bill Clinton, the special recounts the riveting

story of the reporting from Dallas and the CBS Newsroom in New York from the moment President Kennedy was shot until Cronkite's emotional pronouncement of his death at One PM Central Standard Time. It features archival footage of President Kennedy and Cronkite, and memories from the producers, writers, and reporters who were there on that fateful day, including Dan Rather, Bob Schieffer, Marvin Kalb, and Marianne Means.

JFK (Mon 11th and Tue 12th, 9 p.m.), the latest film in the American Experience series The Presidents, offers a fresh assessment of the enigmatic man, featuring interviews with Kennedy family members and noted historians. Forensic experts shed new light on the assassination in NOVA: Cold Case JFK (Wed 13th, 9 p.m.), while Frontline asks, Who Was Lee Harvey Oswald? (Tue 19th, 10 p.m.).

PBS NewsHour (weeknights, 7 p.m.) will air a report on former anchors Robert MacNeil and Jim Lehrer and their coverage of the assassination. And tune in to *MetroFocus* (Thursdays, 8:30 p.m.) for a special interview with Dan Rather, the first reporter to break the news of President Kennedy's assassination.


American Masters: Jimi Hendrix—Hear My Train A Comin'

A PIONEERING ELECTRIC GUITARIST, Jimi Hendrix had only four years of mainstream recognition before his death at age 27, but his music and riveting stage presence left an enduring legacy. This documentary unveils previously unseen performance footage such as the 1968 Miami Pop Festival; features interviews with Paul McCartney, Hendrix's band mates, and others; and concludes with poignant footage from his final performance in Germany in 1970.


